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T²: Who are we?

The Transitioning Together Program (T²) is a mentoring program launched to ensure that every student and family has access to the resources needed to pursue post-secondary education. T^2 provides step-by-step support to Newton North's first generation students and their parents in the process of applying for college. The goal of T^2 is to help these students identify and access the college that is right for them.



Welcome, 2015 Cohort!

On February 4[,] 2014, we welcomed our Class of 2015 Cohort of 30 mentees, their families and 28 mentors for our first meeting of the year! Dr. Jennifer Price spoke about the program and expressed her excitement that we are starting this process earlier than senior year. The timeline and expectations were introduced and then mentees, mentors and families all attended Junior Parent Night together.

Mentees:

- 83% (25 mentees) First generation in their family to attend college in the United States
- 13% (4 mentees) in METCO
- 27% (6 mentees English Language Learner, 2 mentees FLEP-Former ELL
- 23% (7 mentees) in Dover Legacy Scholars (DLS)
- 55% (16 mentees) living with a single parent or guardian
- 63% (19 mentees) receiving Free or Reduced Lunch
- 13% (4 mentees) living with someone other than either one of their biological parents

JUNIORS ON TRACK: Financial Aid 101

Many students and parents come into Transitioning Together uncertain of their futures and what college means for their families, but after our programming, our T² students started to understand that they don't need to fear. They begin to see there is a way, to ask lots of questions and to have hope for the future. Intentional programming and speakers gives access to our cohorts, breaks barriers and empowers families. On March 27, our 2015 cohort gathered in the film lecture hall for a presentation on financing college. Guest lecturer from *Strategies For College*, Todd Weaver, explained some essential messages for students, parents and mentors. From concepts like "understanding the base year" to "calculating your Expected Family Contribution (EFC)," Weaver was able to elucidate the financial aspects of post-secondary opportunities. He provided his top six "critical tactics" for College Financial Aid.

Tactic #1: Understand the concept of THE BASE YEAR and plan accordingly.

Tactic #2: Understand that "Aid Eligibility" is determined by formulas, but in most cases aid eligibility does not equal college funding.

Tactic #3: Do not be deceived by sticker price.

Tactic #4: Run the numbers! Always calculate your Expected Family Contributions (EFC) and learn how to reduce your EFC.

Tactic #5: Know how to pronounce "FAFSA," know how to locate it, and know how to properly complete it-EARLY!

Tactic #6: Know how to effectively fill out a CSS Profile and CSS Profile Supplements for business owners and non-custodial parents.
