Ms. Hall opened the meeting by re-introducing the T² staff, including the newest staff addition, Mr. Aaron Sanders. Mr. Sanders, Dean of the Barry House at NNHS, will serve as a T² Counselor and his role will involve working very closely with students. We are thrilled to have him as part of the team and know that the students will enjoy working with him. Ms. Hall then went on to explain all of the upcoming events for T², including: 2 field trips (UMass-Boston and Framingham State), College Nights, Financial Aid Night, and 3 T² evening meetings. While it certainly sounds like a lot, all of these things are amazing opportunities for the students to get tons of information about specific colleges as well as the college application process.

One important handout that the students received was a list of schools offering Diversity Fly-In programs. These programs, offered by specific colleges, give students with low-income, first generation and/or minority backgrounds the opportunity to visit campus with all of their expenses paid. Students apply to a specific Fly-In program at an individual college. It is a great opportunity for students to visit a school that they otherwise may not have been able to. The fact that these types of programs exist proves to our students what we tell them all the time: colleges want them! First generation students bring a lot of great things to a campus!

Ms. Hall then introduced the speaker for the evening, Ms. Franci DaLuz, Assistant Director of Admissions from UMass-Boston. Franci was born in Brazil and came to the United States with her mom so she could have the opportunity to go to college. Franci told her story of being a first

TRANSITIONING TOGETHER's Alumni Coordinator, Brendan Amedio, asks Luther some questions about his experience:

Tell us a little about your college experience thus far.

As of writing this, I'm a sophomore studying computer science in college. Reflecting on my freshman year, the most important life value I strived to implement is to live with a definite purpose one day at a time. It's very common to over analyze how things will be in the future. Do make long-term goals, but also focus on the baby steps. Wake up every day with small goals that are important to you. "When you spend your days doing what fulfills you, you are attractive." — Thomas Leonard

Now that you are in college, what do you wish you had known before you got there?

Newton North and the T² program helped me tremendously with preparing for college. Always asking questions is better than not asking enough. There's no reason to make hesitant decisions when you have resources that will establish decisiveness. Life already has its challenges, so don't add more difficulty that's not conducive to your success.

Was there a piece of advice (or specific experience) you remember from either your mentor or T² experience that has had a big impact on your transition to college?

I remember all the wonderful retreats the T² faculty took my T² cohort on and the college tours I went on with my great mentor, Betsy. Their insight really helped me make great decisions.

What would you tell students thinking about being in Transitioning Together about the program?

The T² program will set you up for success and the faculty is committed to you helping achieve your goals. If you're a first-generation student there are plenty of resources out there to help you navigate this the college process and this program will be very helpful in meeting your needs.

What suggestions do you have for students about to start the college application process?

Enjoy the processes! You will hear this a million times but it's true: high school goes by really fast so make the most of every moment!

She told the group about the importance of asking questions ("When you're first gen, you don't know what you don't know!"), the value of having mentors and people you can trust, and having the mentality that you shouldn't be afraid to accept help when it is offered to you. Franci's story is inspiring and so relatable for so many T² students.

After Franci's presentation, the group headed down to the Auditorium for Senior Parent Night where they were able to hear from the Counseling Department and their own school counselor about what to expect during the year and throughout the college application process. We are so excited to work with the T² Class of 2019 and know that this year is going to be memorable and exciting for them!

T² mentees participated in the community this summer through the City of Newton Mayor's Summer Intern Program, which strives to "serve as a hands-on learning experience for young adults in the Newton community." Participants dedicate 10-15 hours per week for six weeks of their summer to an internship placement in local businesses, non-profit organizations, and city departments. Quinn Etchie, Director of Youth Services, describes the Mayor's Summer High School Internship Program as "a great opportunity for high school students to learn applicable skills that will serve them greatly in the future." Students, in addition to their time spent at internship placements, also attend a weekly workshop with Ms. Etchie to build skills such as interviewing, financial literacy, and team building. Ms. Etchie speaks highly of the many T² students who participated, stating "they were rockstars in the program."

T² Partnership with Summit Education

Once again this year, T² has partnered with Summit Educational Group in Newton to offer Class of 2019 mentees free ACT test prep. Twenty T² mentees received 25 hours of tutoring, including three diagnostic tests, to prepare for the July 2018 ACT test. We are grateful for our continued partnership as our mentees became more familiar with the ACT format and learned vital test-taking strategies.
